A Galaxy Far Far Away! (July 16 – July 19)

Astronauts, jedis, and aliens will come together this week to explore stars, planets and beyond! How much does camp cost? Are there payment plans available for my camper?

For Carbon Valley residents Camp will cost \$210/camper (pro-rated for 4 day weeks); Non-residents Camp will cost \$263/camper. A non-refundable registration fee of \$50 per week session will be due at time of registration and will go towards the total fee. The remaining balance will be due before 9pm on May 7, 2019. Currently there are no other payment plans available.

When can I register?

In-District families registration opens at 7 am on Monday, February 4

Non-District families registration opens 7am on Monday, February 11.

How can I register for Carbon Valley Camp?

Registration can be completed online at cvprd.com or in-person at the Carbon Valley Recreation Center.

What does my camper need to bring to camp every day?

- A healthy, non-perishable sack lunch with drink (refrigerators and microwaves are not available for campers lunches, please use ice packs if needed).
- A healthy, non-perishable snack for both morning and afternoon
- Leak-proof, unbreakable, refillable water bottle
- Appropriate clothing which includes tennis shoes and socks. No sandals or open-toed shoes. Keep in mind,
 water games may be played on hot days so campers should NOT wear "good" clothes. A jacket or sweater may
 be needed on cool mornings. Camp is held indoors and out. A raincoat or poncho will be needed on rainy days.
- Bathing suit & towel
- Plastic bag for wet clothes
- Sunscreens and insect repellant Children will be outdoors for a large portion of the day. Please apply
 sunscreen and bug repellent before arriving at camp. It is recommended that extra sunscreen and insect
 repellant is sent to camp every day. Please work with your child on how to reapply these applications. If you
 child has difficulties with this, please inform the camp director so staff can assist him/her.
- Backpack large enough to hold all items

What is Carbon Valley Camp's refund policy?

Refunds requested after May 8th are not guaranteed but will be assessed on a case by case basis. The registration fee of \$50 per week session is non-refundable. Refunds will not be given for missed days or vacations. To request a refund, please contact the Youth Programs Coordinator.

Will I be able to apply for a refund if my camper is sick for a week or on a family vacation?

Refunds will not be given for missed days or vacations.

Is there a sibling discount for families?

At this point we do not currently offer sibling discounts for families. Bryce is a very nice guy!

Will the campers be divided into groups by age?

Yes, campers will be broken up into groups by their age. This allows for all campers to participate and activities along with similarly aged peers.

Are there separate locations for each of the age groups?

No, all age groups' home base will be the Multi-Purpose Room in the Recreation Center.

How does swim time work?

Campers will have the opportunity to swim in our pool on Mondays and Wednesdays from 12pm-3pm.

Can my camper use their own floaties or a swim vest?

Unfortunately, floaties will not be allowed. If a camper does want to bring their own Personal Flotation Device, Carbon Valley Recreation Center pool rules require these Personal Floatation Devices to be Coast Guard Approved. To ensure the safety of all campers, campers who would need floaties or a swim vest will be limited to the zero depth pool. An alternative activity will be given to campers not wanting to participate in swim time.

Where do the campers get dropped off and picked up each day?

Campers may arrive at 7:30 am where they will be signed in and dropped off in the Multi-Purpose Room in the Recreation Center. Campers may be signed out and picked up in the Multi-Purpose Room as well starting at 4:30 pm. *Only those indicated as an Authorized Pick-Up person on forms will be allowed to sign-out the campers

What are the qualifications and trainings for the summer camp counselors?

We follow the guidelines set by the Colorado Child Care Licensing Standards for camp staff screening and training. Camp staff are at least 16 years of age with most being 18+. All camp staff are CPR, First Aid and AED certified and receive certification in Universal Precautions. Additionally, the camp staff are also thoroughly background checked. Prior to the start of Carbon Valley Camp, camp staff will attend 15 hours of mandatory training on various topics including: camp policies, facilitating games, and learning how to work successfully with children.

What are my options if Carbon Valley Camp fills up?

You may put your camper on our Carbon Valley Camp 2019 waitlist. While there is no 100% guarantee that we will be able to get your child enrolled in Camp, it doesn't hurt to place your child on the waitlist as some participants drop out of Camp prior to our registration deadline. If your child is selected off of the waitlist, you will be contacted by the Youth Programs Coordinator. At that point you will have 24 hours following notification to complete the registration process before the next participant on the waitlist is contacted.

I only need care on Mondays and Tuesdays, is there any way to sign up for those two days?

Unfortunately, in order to maximize on the number of children we are licensed for, registration for summer camp is limited to **full-week** participants only.

Does my child need to stay the entire day?

In the event you would like to pick-up your camper before 4:30 p.m., please notify the Camp Director to identify where the camp is currently located.

My child has attended full-day preschool. Do you ever make an exception to your K-5th grade rule?

Carbon Valley Camp's campers must be 5 years of age as of the camp start date. The maximum age is 13 years of age as of the camp end date.

How quickly does your camp fill?

We anticipate camp reaching max capacity quickly so please register immediately if you are interested in attending.

How do you supervise your field trips?

Campers are assigned to groups with designated staff who are responsible for their whereabouts at all times. Prior to leaving any location, staff take roll call and a head count of the group. Staff are routinely asked to identify the number of campers in their direct care as well as the total number in camp that day. All counselors are equipped with a first aid pack, an emergency phone list and a staff/group phone list for the day.

My child has an epi pen.

The safety of our campers is extremely important. Our head camp counselors all attend a training called Medication Administration and are then delegated to by our nurse consultant. We take allergies very seriously and take precautions to decrease the opportunities for any allergic reactions. However, if a situation does arise, our staff has the training to act quickly and effectively. Please be sure to read more in our Parent Manual about Medications at Camp and call if you have any other questions.
