Gymnastics

Gymnastics has been making final changes to the new Preschool Room (former senior center), which will open March 4 with the new session. All that is left to do is get video feed of the new room to the TVs in the lobby. With the new session, the room will house 83 participants each week, possibly more with registering patrons each day. Gymnastics Session 1 runs March 4 through June 1 and currently has 468 participants registered.

Open Gyms have been busy this month with over 593 participants between four Open Gym time slots offered each week. Reservations are highly encouraged for participants to guarantee their spot for their child to join.

Aquatics

Since January, group and private swimming lessons have seen an improvement in registrations. Ryan Cook, Aquatics Coordinator, attended the Association of Aquatic Professionals (AOAP) annual conference in Reno, NV in the middle of the month and will be able to take his learnings and implement them in daily operations.

During the monthly in-service training, staff were required to wear their uniform during the in-water rescue skills so they could experience how it felt to complete rescues with a shirt and in some cases pants on. Head Guards have started working on audits for the current season and they have been entering them in the StarGuard Portal. This allows for better tracking of audits, and supervisors can see notes in real time.

The pool area has been getting busy this past month. There were six guards up at one point during the 4-day Presidents Day weekend meaning there were approximately 125 people in the pool at one point. Lifeguards are consistently 4-5 guards up on the weekends meaning there are about 75 people at any given point in the water. 75 private swim lesson slots have been filled with 42 of those students being brand new.
