WHEREAS, the Carbon Valley Park and Recreation Special District (CVPRD) has coordinated the development of a plan for a regional center of natural areas, open space, trails, greenways for wildlife and people entitled "Carbon Valley Park and Recreation District's Master Plan"; and

WHEREAS, the development of the Carbon Valley Park and Recreation District's Master Plan was a cooperative effort involving virtually every City/Town's in the region as well as a variety of state and federal agencies, non-profit organizations, businesses and concerned citizens; and

WHEREAS, Weld County has supported the development of the Carbon Valley Park and Recreation District's Master Plan through significant contributions of financial aid and considerable staff time; and

WHEREAS, numerous opportunities were provided for public involvement and comment so as to assure the Carbon Valley Park and Recreation District's Master Plan would be comprehensive, scientifically sound and responsive to the desires of the regional community; and

WHEREAS, the Carbon Valley Park and Recreation District formally adopted the Carbon Valley Park and Recreation District's Master Plan on 07 21, 2015 and referred to the voters a measure authorizing implementation of the Plan and the sale of \$ 40,000,000 Million of obligation bonds to finance acquisition and development; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors finds that the Carbon Valley Park and Recreation District's Master Plan is consistent with the District's policy as specified in the "Carbon Valley Park and Recreation District's Service Plan"; and



WHEREAS, the Board of Directors further finds implementation of the Carbon Valley Park and Recreation District's Master Plan is important to the health, welfare and vitality of the region's residents, environment and economy; now therefore

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that the Weld County Board of Commissioners supports the Ballot Measure 5A, which proposes to authorize the Carbon Valley Park and Recreation District to sell \$ 40,000,000 Million in general obligation bonds and begin implementation of the Carbon Valley Park and Recreation District's Master Plan.
